HAS YOUR CHILD BEEN ADOPTED FROM CARE?

Is your child currently living with you under a Special Guardianship Order or Child Arrangement Order, but has been looked after in the past under the Care of a Local Authority? You may be aware that schools receive additional funding for children in receipt of Free School Meals, however you may not know that this additional funding is also available to schools for some pupils who:

- left care under a Residential Order:
- left care under a Special Guardianship Order;
- were adopted from care.

For confidentiality reasons, the local authority does not identify these pupils and it is for you as the parent/guardian to decide whether to disclose this information about your child to the school. If you are willing to share this information with the school, the school will be able to claim funding each year.

Whilst the Pupil Premium funding is not ring-fenced for individual previously looked after children, often all children in a class will reap some benefit from how the school spends its pupil premium, such as a teaching assistant in the class or specific interventions available. National statistics show that children who have been in care face unique challenges at school and often struggle to keep up with their peers. It is vital that they are given the targeted support they need and the education they deserve to help them get on in life.

The process for the school to claim the Pupil Premium Plus is through self-declaration in early October. If you would like us to claim, you must declare your child/children's status to the school before then. The Department for Education requires you to provide evidence of your child's status by sharing your Adoption/Special Guardianship/Child Arrangement Order or showing a letter from the local authority confirming that they placed your child with you. Please be reassured that this information will be treated in the strictest confidence and that names and details are not part of the census. Please contact us should you wish to declare your child's previously looked after status. Please be aware that you must declare your child's status <u>each time they move to a new school</u>. If you have previously declared their status to us, you do not need to do so again.

There is no obligation for you to share this information with us, but doing so will help both your child and the school to benefit from this funding. Any information received will be treated with the strictest confidence.

LOST PROPERTY

Please label <u>ALL</u> items of clothing for your child - including coats and shoes! We know how expensive it can be buying everything ready for a new school year so let's make sure that everything that you have for your child can be returned to them if anything gets misplaced. Thank you.

SAFETY UPDATES

- A polite reminder we kindly ask that parents do not speak to children through the school gates
 during playtimes and lunch times if you are passing the school. We are aware it is tempting to wave and
 call children's names but for the safety and security of all children, please refrain from doing this.
 Thank you.
- Please remember to cut all grapes or small tomatoes that you send into school in half lengthwise, as
 they can be a choking hazard. We ask this of everyone just in case one escapes a lunchbox, rolls away
 and proves too tempting for one of our younger children. Thank you so much for helping to keep all our
 children safe.
- If your child has a food allergy or a medical condition that needs lunchtime staff to have raised awareness, they may mention that they have been given a special yellow bracelet to wear at lunchtime. We have introduced this system as more than 10% of our children now need this extra support and this will make sure all lunchtime staff are aware.
- Please can you help us remind our children that they should dismount their scooter or bike when on school grounds. We would not want any accidents at the start of the new school year.

• I thought it would be useful to provide some clarification over food being brought to school to celebrate a birthday. There has been some confusion at the start of term, due to the wording in the September 2025 newsletter. As a school we love to celebrate a birthday, however we have to be mindful of the ever-growing number of children with allergies. We therefore ask if you wish to bring in food (sweets/cake etc.) to celebrate your child's birthday, that it is brought in INDIVIDUAL sealed packets. Parents and carers can then make the decision whether their child can have the birthday treat. Unfortunately, staff often do not have time to cut whole cakes and locate sealed bags for distribution. Thank you in advance, for your understanding.

<u>PUNCTUALITY</u>

A polite reminder of the importance of children arriving to school on time. A lot of children are entering through the main office and are missing their morning mark. Please make every effort to use the correct entrance to ensure a settled start to the day for your child. Children must enter through their allocated door between 8.45am and 8.50am (unless it has been agreed otherwise). Arrivals after this time will receive a late mark and if after 9.05am this will then be an unauthorised mark as registers are closed. If you have any concerns, please contact Miss. Currell our attendance officer.

SCHOOL MEALS

Please can we ask you not to change dinner choices without notifying the school office. Swapping between meals and packed lunches on a daily basis cannot be accommodated. Changes can be made at the beginning of each half-term or after 4 weeks. Thank you for your understanding.

The DfE also strongly encourages primary schools to deliver sex education to help prepare children for their transition to secondary school.

Up to now, we have used a PSHE (Personal, Social and Health Education) resource called Jigsaw across our school. However, from September 2025 we are changing the programme we follow. After lots of research, we have chosen to use resources from the leading children's health and wellbeing charity, Coram Life Education (CLE) to support us in meeting these legal requirements. 
