BOOK ISSUE

We have been made aware of an issue with some books by Andrew Cope. Please see the message below from the publisher Penguin Random House:

In the front and/or back of some editions of the Spy Dog, Spy Cat and Spy Pups series there is a reference to the author, Andrew Cope's, former website for the series which was owned and managed by him. We understand an unconnected third party has recently taken control of the domain name and is using it to display a different website with inappropriate adult content. This website is not associated with Puffin or Andrew Cope. Please do not visit it and ensure that children do not visit it either. We are taking this extremely seriously and are acting on this issue as a matter of urgency through the appropriate channels to get this website removed. This is an in-depth and complex legal process and will take time. We have immediately paused on the sale and distribution of the books whilst we deal with this matter. We ask that you please check your editions and temporarily remove affected copies from children's collections'.

Teachers have been made aware and will remove any copies they find. We have removed them from our vending machine, too. If your child currently has a school copy please return it to the teacher.

Hi, my name is <u>Amy Warnes</u>, my son Jacob is in Year 3 at Throston. As a working parent, I'm passionate about every child feeling happy and confident! I am an Organisational Development & HR Manager on a Chemical Site. Focusing on people and their wellbeing whilst also looking at strategic growth and business development. I have experience as a youth worker and in my current role I actively promote STEM within school(s). I believe that my experience will add value to this role and can support promoting wellbeing and inclusion. I am excited for this opportunity. I will be an advocate for parents' voices. I believe my energetic, friendly and empathetic attitude, along with communication skills and strategic thinking could support and add value to the school governing body.

R.H.E UPDATE FROM MRS. SAMUEL

Many thanks to all of you who responded to our recent consultation on Relationships and \underline{H} ealth \underline{E} ducation in school.

Parents' views were very evenly split as to whether to include sexual intercourse in our Year 6 curriculum. Last half-term Governors made the decision <u>not</u> to expand our curriculum beyond the statutory curriculum.

To safeguard our children and to be in line with statutory guidance, we ensure that both boys and girls are prepared for the changes that adolescence brings. The statutory national curriculum for science includes naming the main external body parts, understanding the human



body as it grows from birth to old age (including puberty) and reproduction in some plants and animals. In line with guidance from the NHS that a number of girls begin to menstruate at the age of 8, we use the expertise of the school nursing service to begin to teach about puberty in Year 4. This is re-visited in Year 6, where children's questions are typically more in depth.

Naming parts of the body, including genitalia, also comes under statutory Relationships Education which states that children should know 'how to report concerns or abuse, and the vocabulary and confidence to do so'. In addition, we teach extensively about safe, respectful relationships, and all children are taught the NSPCC PANTS rules: https://www.nspcc.org.uk/advice-for-families/pants-underwear-rule.

After careful consideration, we have decided not to teach about sexual intercourse, but if a child asked a question about this, we would answer them in an age - and stage - appropriate way, outside of the whole-class lesson, with an emphasis on supporting the child. This may include asking a pupil to speak to their parents or carer, signposting to support services if needed, and recognising that children whose questions go unanswered might instead turn to inappropriate sources of information, including online.

We have been supported in our considerations by John Leary, our Vice-Chair of Governors and Assistant Headteacher (Personal Development) at High Tunstall as we are committed to ensuring that the transition phase before moving to secondary school supports pupils' ongoing emotional and physical development effectively. High Tunstall are aware of our curriculum and are able to build on it in Year 7 and beyond, in the context of a more detailed secondary curriculum which covers intimate and sexual relationships.
